## WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I THINK SOMEONE IS EXPERIENCING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

- Listen and believe them.
- Help them get medical attention if they need it.
- Let them know they are not alone and that they do not deserve to be abused.
- Support them in making their own decisions. Remind them only they know what is best for themselves, but that they are not alone.
- Call an advocate to guide you in supporting the individual.
- Let them know they have options and encourage them to call Voices Against Violence or a domestic violence program near them.

Voices is here to help, offering safe shelter, safety planning services and emotional support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We help anyone in need, and their families; all services are free and confidential.





# A SURVIVORS STORY: HOW VOICES HELPED ONE FAMILY FIND HOPE, HEALING, AND SAFETY.

"For many years I lived with an abusive husband. Living a nightmare that I couldn't wake up from...I felt alone.

I was homeless with my three daughters. I had no self-worth and I was broken down with no hope. I was far from my family when I made the call to Voices Against Violence. Right from that first phone call the warmth, caring and kindness was something I'd never encountered.

#### Voices saved my life.

A year later, I'm now moving into a brand new town house. I've had many struggles thrown my way over the past year and I have learned to overcome them because of Voices. They have taught me how to be a strong, independent and assertive woman. They have changed my life, as well as saved it. I can't express in words the gratitude for all the members at Voices that let me live again."
